#### Women and Work Pressure


In Forbes, it discusses how women work more than ever. Women feel pressure to work and aid in living costs.

## Minimum Wage

- In 1970 minimum wage is \$1.60
- In 2007 minimum wage is \$7.25
- It is 353% increase, but all other prices went up.



### Tuition Increases

- In 1970, one year of tuition at a public university was \$1,207
- You could work all year and be able to afford tuition.
- In 2007 one year of tuition at a public university is \$11,304.
- The only way to afford to work and pay tuition would be student loans.
- That is 994% increase, whereas the wage increase is only 334%

# Working and School


- It is recommended students should work only 20hr while attending school.
- Nation wide 17% of students worked 20-34hrs a week
- Nationwide 6% worked 35+hr a week

- In 1960, college graduates got their first job (lasts 3+ years) at 24
- In 2010, college graduates got their first job (lasts 3+ years) at 28-32

### Paying for Tuition

41% rely on financial aid
22% is paid by parents
18% pay their way
16% rely on scholar scholarships

The average student loan debt is 5 times as more during the 1980's
